Please note:

- a) Divisions 15 or 16 include scholars who reach the age of 15 or 16 respectively on or before 31/12/03. (The year that Stage 2 lessons commenced).

- c) Make certain that the section and question number are recorded in the left hand margin of each sheet.
- d) Leave a space between each answer. 2-3 lines.
- e) The suggested time for each section is a guide only. The total time for the examination is limited to 90 minutes plus an allowance for completing the paragraph started before time was up. One or two sentences would be a reasonable allowance to complete the paragraph. The 90 minutes commences when the Superintendent is satisfied that the scholars have had sufficient opportunity to read the questions and receive any explanations and answers to queries.

➡ SECTION 'A' - 8 QUESTIONS: (7 marks each) Suggested time 50 minutes

Paragraph answers only are required for this section.

1. Supply a good definition of "Faith".
2. What instruction was Joshua given when he was appointed as Israel's new leader?
3. What lesson did James draw from the life of Rahab?
4. What were the signs that God gave to Gideon to show that He would save Israel by his hand?
5. How was Ruth's faith in the God of Israel rewarded?
6. Outline Samuel's conversation with Saul when he returned from the destruction of the Amalekites.
7. How did David's conflict and victory over Goliath point forward to future events?
8. God told David that He would build him an house. Explain what God meant.

➡ SECTION 'B' - 2 QUESTIONS: (22 marks each) Suggested time 40 minutes

Select two questions only from the following.

2. What was a Nazarite and why was Samson to be a Nazarite from the womb?
3. What lessons do we learn from the training of Samuel?
4. List four major aspects of the promise made to David and explain their fulfilment.
